# THANET COAST'S BIG DRAW

... is a collaborative project by 20 local artists working with environmental artist, Paul Goodrick, co-ordinated by the Thanet Coast Project. It links into the national campaign to celebrate the importance of drawing, encouraging creativity & shared experiences, & to the BBC's British Isles: A Natural History.

It aims to highlight the marine life that once existed around this area, which was once covered by a warm shallow sea. The art work itself shows fossils – today's evidence of these times gone by, which have stood the test of time for 80 million years in the surrounding chalk cliffs. However, today's collaborative art is in stark contrast... a temporary picture – that will be washed away with the daily cycle of nature – the next incoming tide!
