




































Internationally important coastal bird populations

Golden plover

- Winter visitors
- Found mainly on pasture
 & on the mudflats at
 Sandwich Bay
- Can form very large flocks of 2 to 10,000 birds





Turnstone

- Breed in arctic & spend winter in Thanet (Oct-April)
- Roost sites found all around the chalk coast
- Feed on chalk reefs & beaches crustaceans, periwinkles & peeler crabs
- Vulnerable to disturbance from people & dogs...

- To avoid disturbing birds, walk your dog towards the back of the shore and try to avoid the feeding birds along the tide line, or at times around high tide (when the beach area is smaller)
- · Keep away from known bird roosts and take note of any signs requesting your co-operation in these areas
- Do not allow your dog to chase birds on the beach as this stops them from feeding and roosting
- Keep your dog on a lead when:
 - o near feeding or roosting birds;
 - on shingle from April to July inclusive because of ground-nesting breeding birds;
 - o in areas used by other recreational activities, as boisterous dogs can scare both birds and people.
- · Please clean up after your dog to keep the beach safe and clean for other users.

It is illegal not to clean up in every public place in Thanet. This is rigorously enforced with fixed penalty notices of £100, (less for early payment), and dog owners can be prosecuted and fined up to £1,000. Over 100 people have fallen 'foul' of the law, so please clean up!

Follow the local Dog Controls (PSPOs)

Dogs are banned from some of Thanet's beaches during the summer. Please obey the signs on the beaches or check the details at Thanet Tourism or local authority website. The maximum penalty for failing to obey the Dog Control Order is £1000. For further information see: Thanet Council's Dog PSPOs & advice on Thanet beaches; or our advisory page on Dogs on the Thanet Coast.

PLEASE NOTE: Access restrictions have changed following public consultation and launch of the national England Coastal Path in 2016 Access Restrictions within Pegwell Bay National Nature Reserve (updated with TDC's Dog Control PSPO in 2023).

Shellfish Harvesting and Fixed Netting Code

Shellfish and other marine life

- Tread carefully to avoid damage to the rocky chalk shore especially on the lower shore where the chalk is most fragile
- Always put rocks and seaweed back the way they were there are animals underneath which need them for shelter.
- Shellfish should be collected by hand only and without breaking the chalk rocks (Local IFCA bylaws allow for the collection of periwinkle by hand only)
- Take only enough for your own needs to a maximum of 5kg (half a normal size bucket) of periwinkles collected by one person per day to ensure that many are left for other collectors and the species can still thrive. Other species should be left to flourish.
- Species attached to the chalk reef (eg pacific oysters and limpets) should be left as the reef is easily damaged if removed
- Select only the larger shellfish to ensure that younger ones can continue to grow on and establish the next generation
- Take care to avoid putting feeding or roosting birds to flight
- Avoid collecting shellfish during 'Temporary Prohibition Orders' (Fishery Products and Live Shellfish) when it is a criminal offence to collection

- Abide by food safety standards and 'guidelines for safe working in estuaries and tidal areas' (Health and Safety Executive)

Additional Codes for 'Fixed Netting' on shore

- Fixed nets should comply with both national and local fishery bylaws, in that they shall:
 - be cleared within every 30 hours
 - be marked at each end (by dahn bouys 1.5m above water) with 30sq cm flag clearly marked with name address or postcode
 - o be under 100 metres in length
 - avoid the River Stour (to protect migratory species)
- Contact the <u>Kent and Essex Inshore Fisheries and Conservation Authority</u> for details and advice, and the <u>Environmental Agency</u> for information on the fishing for salmon, sea trout, eels and the use of fyke nets.
- · Care should be taken to avoid damage to the chalk shore and marine life when putting up fixed nets
- Take away and dispose of any entangled rubbish or disintegrating nets in suitable bins
- Avoid designated coastal activity areas or launch sites as nets could entangle and endanger other coastal users










The regular surveys per month

Monitoring schedule

- Four surveys a month given as a guide:
 - 2 x 1st full week of the month (1 High & 1 Low Tide surveys on any <u>weekday</u>)
 - 2 x 3rd full weekend of the month (1 High & 1 Low Tide surveys on a weekend day)

 There will be once a year opportunity to meet with other coastal wardens, to network, review the year and scheme and to help share your experiences (Annual Forum).



 We welcome all volunteers, and are committed to honouring principles on equality and inclusion.



 We will ensure that your personal data remains confidential under the Data Protection Act.



What we expect from you as a Coastal Warden:

 To adopt a section of our local North East Kent coastline.



Look after your section of coast ('eyes & ears of the coastline') and
 undertake activity surveys, and
 contribute towards citizen science
 Surveys (eg 'Shoresearch' when close to your bay).



 Perform your volunteer tasks safely (see health and safety advice/ risk assessment) - looking out for and recording any potential dangers.



 Be respectful of the wildlife and environment by following NEKMPA/ Thanet's Coastal Codes, local PSPOs, and bay information signs when out on the foreshore.



 To take an interest in your role as Coastal Warden and work towards achieving the aims of the volunteering scheme.



 To consider developing your role by attending optional training sessions or volunteering at events - or helping collaborations, in partnership with other project & initiatives.



 Maintain good relations with staff and other volunteers.



 Act as an ambassador for the volunteering and NEKMPA management scheme, and be courteous to the public.



Please remember that you are a volunteer, with no legal responsibilities or powers. You should not get involved in incidents, but report them to the appropriate person.

Tide Times

Before you go

- Know your bay Make sure that you are aware of any hazardous features at your adopted stretch of coastline, e.g., tide cut-off points or quick sand
- Check tide times to avoid getting cut off from the land
- Check the weather conditions Avoid going out in adverse weather conditions, e.g., a storm, strong gales, or thick fog.
- Best to buddy up if possible or if going alone, tell someone which part of the foreshore you will be surveying and what time you expect to return.
- If involved on your own beach clean, make sure you have carried of a risk assessment (using guidance such as given by Beachwatch/MCS)

Clothing & Equipment:



- Always carry your 'Advice for Reporting Incidents' card / telephone numbers (In your notes. You also have GotD 'Kent Coastal Contact Card'
- Wear suitable clothing for the weather conditions take water with you in the summer
- Be prepared for a change in weather carry a spare layer of clothing, hat, or sun cream (depending on the season)
- Wear appropriate footwear for walking on rocks and slippery surfaces
- It helps to wear high visibility clothing so that you can be seen easily by other coastal users
- Wear protective gloves if you intend to take part in a beach clean or shorelife survey
- If possible, take a mobile phone with you. Make sure that batteries are fully charged, the devices are kept dry and that you know the available reception areas in your bay.

On the Coast:

- Take care near cliff edges
 - On the top, edges can give way
 - At the bottom, avoid cliff falls
 - Cliff falls regularly occur in cold weather
- Beware of walking on slippery rocks, slopes or near the edge of promenades
- Keep away from soft sand and mud
- Always wash your hands after handling anything on the foreshore
- Know your adopted bay activity zones, bylaws and local beach safety information (displayed at main bays between April-September)
- Be aware of other activities taking place in the bay
- Treat other coastal users with respect
- Do not touch stranded or dead marine mammals
- Do not touch contaminated litter, pollution or faeces found on the coast
- Never intervene in an anti-social incident, instead report it to the appropriate authority.


